Welcome to the sun!

It was so lovely to see the sun this week, and Mr Steward, our site manager, thinks that we might be able to start using the field from next week all being well as the sun should dry it out a little! Some reminders and other information:

- Please make sure that children have a **named water bottle** in school – they can have a drink and lunchtimes in the hall, but the water bottle is their source of water for the rest of the day.
- Please make sure that children have a **sunhat** in school when the forecast is hot. There is little shade on the playground, and PE lessons will also still take place in all but the most extreme weather.
- **Please do not send suncream into school with children.** We can't apply suncream to children at school, nor can children keep their own suncream in school. However, there are many brands available that advertise 8 hour coverage: if you apply this before school this will last children until the end of the day.
- Once the sun isn't quite as prominent, please make sure children have a waterproof in school – this can be a small one in their bags, but it does mean if the weather turns that we can still go outside even in drizzle.

We had a fantastic morning on Wednesday going down to the chapel to watch a theatre production of The Jungle Book. The children loved it, and the Year 5s had an added bonus of taking part in a workshop to find out how the production was put together.

Uniform Reminders:

As it is getting warmer, please can I remind you of our PE kit? Our uniform is:

- A pair of black gym shorts. Any logos or embellishments must be small and discreet.
- A black or dark coloured gym bag. Any logos or embellishments must be small and discreet.
- One pair of trainers with non-marking soles. These must not be studded.
- Plain black jogging bottoms
- White school logo polo shirt
- Black jumper with school logo

Some children are coming in with PE kit that is not part of the uniform, but it is especially important that the rules are followed as our children are in their PE kit all day on their PE day and therefore representing the school in the community.
