

All the end of year assessments in English will follow the GCSE English Language curriculum. AQA, the exam board we follow, has designed specific differentiated papers for years 7-10 which we will mark to gain an understanding of both reading and writing skills needs linked specifically to GCSE assessment objectives across all year groups. This data will inform our curriculum planning and intervention for next academic year.

YEARS 7

Year 7 will complete a Paper 1 assessment of 1 hour and 45 minutes. This is separated in to Section A (reading) and Section B (writing) and having 80 marks available.

For Section A, students get either a 20th or 21st century extract (approximately 1 side of A4) and they must answer 4 questions based on this extract.

Q1 (4 marks)- list 4 ideas from the beginning of the extract

Q2 (8 marks)- analyse language in a part of the extract

Q3 (8 marks)- how the whole extract uses structure to interest the readers

Q4 (20 marks)- to what extent do you agree with a statement about a section of the text

For Section B, students get a choice of 2 descriptive writing tasks (1 has a picture as a stimulus, the other gives them a topic to write about) and this is marked out of 40 marks.

In the summer term, all year 7 students will sit a one hour end of year assessment. This will contain a mixture of multiple choice, calculation, short and long answer questions.

The assessment could include any of the topics covered this year in science:


1. **Forces**
Balanced and unbalanced forces, speed, distance-time graphs, gravity.
2. **Electromagnets**
Potential difference, resistance and current, series and parallel circuits.
3. **Energy**
Energy in food, energy resources, energy and power.
4. **Waves**
Sound waves, loudness, amplitude, pitch and frequency; light, reflection and refraction, the eye and vision.
5. **Matter**
The particle model and states of matter, changes of state, diffusion and gas pressure; pure substances, mixtures, solutions filtration, evaporation and distillation, chromatography.
6. **Reactions**
Chemical reactions, acids and alkalis, making salts, reactions of metals with acid, water and oxygen, displacement reactions.
7. **Earth**
Structure of the Earth, sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks, the rock cycle, ceramics; the night sky, the Solar System, the Earth, phases of the Moon.
8. **Organisms**
Levels of organisation – cells, tissues, organs and organ systems, the skeleton and muscles; microscopes and magnification, plant and animal cells, specialised cells, cell diffusion and uni-cellular organisms.
9. **Ecosystems**
Food chains and webs, ecosystems and competition; flowers and pollination, fertilisation and germination, seed dispersal.
10. **Genes**
Variation, adaptations to the environment; adolescence, reproductive systems, fertilisation and implantation, foetal development and the menstrual cycle.

Geography



In the final term of year 7, students will be required to sit an assessment in geography that will bring together all of their understanding from throughout the whole year.

This assessment will be 1 hour in duration and will have a wide variety of questions, from multiple choice, to extended writing.

As year 7 have mostly concentrated on physical geography and basic geography skills this year, the assessment will reflect this.

What do students need to know?

- Key geography skills: compass points, grid references and map symbols
- How to add data to blank tables
- The seven continents of the world and where they are
- The structure of the Earth
- The causes and effects of volcanic eruptions
- Features found along a rivers course
- Causes and effects of flooding



History

All the end of year assessments in History will follow the GCSE History question stems format. For Year 7 the questions have been adapted to reflect the Key Stage 3 curriculum skills required and age ability. Students will complete these question types based on topic contents that they have covered in History lessons so far this year.

This data will inform our curriculum planning and intervention for next academic year.

YEAR 7

Will have one hour to complete 3 extended answer questions containing the following question stems –

- Describe key features of..... [4]
- Explain why[12]
- Form a judgement regarding the extent to which they agree or disagree with a statement [16]

The paper will be out of **32 marks** and will cover the following topics –

- The Tudor monarchs from 1485-1603 including key events such as – The Princes in the Tower, Henry's VIII break with Rome, Henry VIII's wives, the religious changes under Edward VI and Mary I, issues regarding the succession of Elizabeth I, threats to Elizabeth's reign (plots, Mary Queen of Scots and the Spanish Armada), and the end of the Tudor dynasty.
- The Stuart monarchs from 1603-1688 including key events such as - The gunpowder plot (1605), Charles I, causes of the English Civil war, developments of the Civil War, the regicide and the Protectorate.

Year 7 will be assessed on their reading and writing skills. The reading assessment will consist on multiple choice questions and answering questions about a text in English and Spanish. The topics that they will need to revise for the reading assessment are: school, free time, sports, furniture in bedroom, food, and rooms in a house. The second part of the assessment will consist on producing a piece of writing about themselves (describing themselves and their family, their opinion about school subject, talking about free time and using the near future tense to describe future plans).
