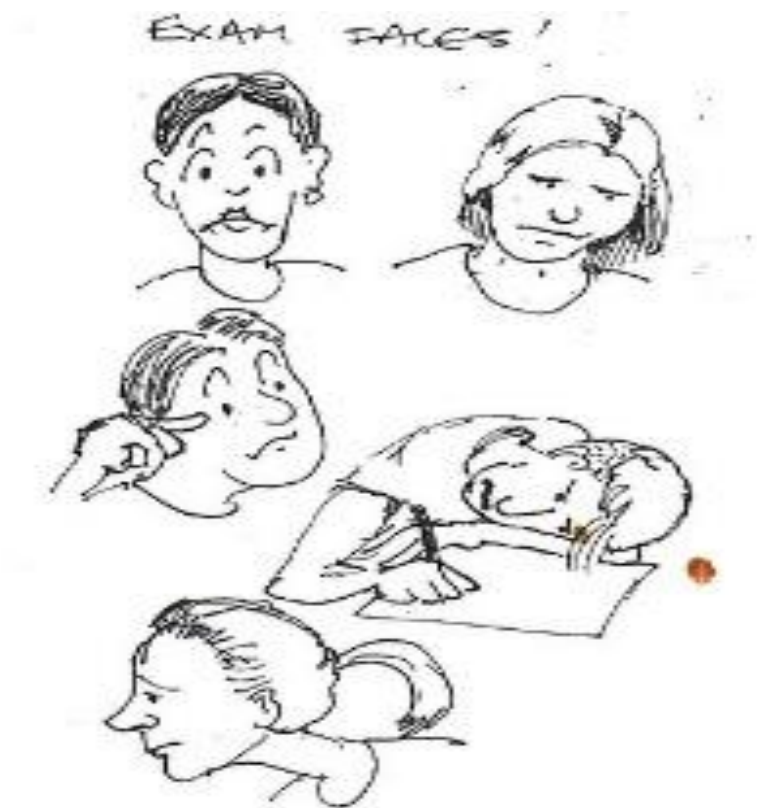

All the end of year assessments in English will follow the GCSE English Language curriculum. AQA, the exam board we follow, has designed specific differentiated papers for years 7-10 which we will mark to gain an understanding of both reading and writing skills needs linked specifically to GCSE assessment objectives across all year groups. This data will inform our curriculum planning and intervention for next academic year.

Year 9 students will complete a Paper 1 assessment of 1 hour and 45 minutes. This is separated in to Section A (reading) and Section B (writing) and having 80 marks available.

For Section A, students get either a 20th or 21st century extract (approximately 1 side of A4) and they must answer 4 questions based on this extract.

Q1 (4 marks)- list 4 ideas from the beginning of the extract

Q2 (8 marks)- analyse language in a part of the extract

Q3 (8 marks)- how the whole extract uses structure to interest the readers

Q4 (20 marks)- to what extent do you agree with a statement about a section of the text

For Section B, students get a choice of 2 descriptive writing tasks (1 has a picture as a stimulus, the other gives them a topic to write about) and this is marked out of 40 marks.

The end of year science exams will consist of three papers - one each for biology, chemistry and physics. These will directly mirror the format of the exam board papers and will contain a mixture of multiple choice, short and long answer questions. Each paper will be 1 hour 15 minutes long.

Biology paper 1

- Bioenergetics

Chemistry paper 1

- Atomic structure and the periodic table
- Bonding, structure and the properties of matter
- Quantitative chemistry
- Chemical changes

- Atomic structure

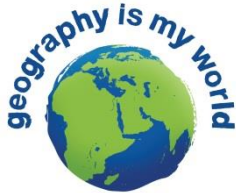

Geography



In the final term of year 9, students will be required to sit an assessment in geography that will bring together all of their understanding from throughout the GCSE course content they have covered so far.

This assessment will be 1 hour in duration and will have a wide variety of questions, from multiple choice, to extended writing.

The first module that students have covered this term is: The challenge of natural hazards (Paper 1: topic A). This includes work about tectonic hazards, weather hazards and climate change.

What do students need to know?

- The structure of the Earth
- Tectonic processes (including different types of plate boundary and movement)
- Why people live in areas at risk of hazards
- Earthquake management
- Global atmospheric circulation
- Distribution and characteristics of tropical storms
- Natural and human causes of climate change
- Ways of mitigating climate change
- Key case studies
 - Haiti (LIC earthquake)
 - Christchurch (HIC earthquake)
 - Typhoon Haiyan
 - The Beast from the East

History

All the end of year assessments in History will follow the GCSE History question stems format. Year 9 students have been completing units based around GCSE style questions. Since Easter students have been studying content that they will be tested on for their real GCSE exams in Year 11.

This data will inform our curriculum planning and intervention for next academic year.

For GCSE History we follow the Edexcel specification. Students will be required to sit 3 exams at the end of Year 11. For the June end of year exams students in Year 9 will sit part of a GCSE style paper.

Year 9 will complete a GCSE exam style paper on the 'International relations and the Cold War, 1941-91' topic. For this unit, which forms section A of Paper 2, students will be asked 4 questions in total. These questions could be on any content studied during this unit, but the 'type' of question will not change from year to year. The question types that students will complete for this paper are shown below –

- **Question 1** - Explain two consequences of..... [8]
- **Question 2** - Write a narrative account analysing [8]
- **Question 3** - Explain the importance of[8] x2

PLEASE NOTE THAT students will need to complete two separate answers for question 3 from a choice of three options. This will make 4 questions in total for the 1 hour paper.

The paper will be out of **32 marks** and will include the following topics –

- The origins of the Cold War, 1941-58; including – Early tensions between East and West, the Development of the Cold War and the intensification of the Cold War.
- Cold War crises, 1958-1970; including – Berlin 1958-63: increased tension and the impact of the Berlin Wall, and the Cuban Missile Crisis.

Revision ideas

CGP revision guides for GCSE Edexcel 9-1 History are available to purchase via parentpay at a cost of £3.25.

All students have access to GCSEpod through their school email. This is an app that can be downloaded on to phones and other mobile devices or accessed via www.gcsepod.com. This service is free to students and contains all the content required for all four History GCSE topics as well as most other subjects. I highly recommend using GCSEpod and have created playlists for students which have been linked via Show My Homework.

ESPAÑOL

Year 9 will be assessed on their reading skills. The exam will last one hour and will assess students on different GCSE topics. For instance, the main topics are: family, school facilities, school subjects, teachers, school clubs, understanding description of rooms and houses, holidays, free time, films and TV programmes, future plans and places in town. Students will be required to complete a wide range of activities such as multiple choice, yes/no questions, answering questions in English or Spanish and a short translation into English.
